WHAT PROGRESS HAS THE JAGAN GOVERNMENT MADE BY IMPLEMENTING THESE PRINCIPLES?

PER CAPITA INCOME



During the fiscal year 2018-19, Andhra Pradesh's per capita income was at the 17th position in the national rankings. Notably, the state witnessed a remarkable ascent to the **9th position by 2022-23** under Jagan's government

GSDP GROWTH RATE

In 2018-19, as per RBI data, Andhra Pradesh was ranked 22nd in the country for its GSDP growth rate. Under the leadership of Jagan, the state catapulted to the **1st position by 2021-22**



EASE OF DOING BUSINESS





DEBT GROWTH RATE



Between 2014 and 2019, the state experienced a substantial 169% increase in its debt during Chandrababu's tenure. However, from 2019 to 2023, Jagan's government managed to significantly curtail the debt growth rate, **limiting it to a mere 58%**

In Ease of Doing Business, Andhra Pradesh's remarkable achievements were evident as the state clinched the coveted **top position in the rankings for two consecutive years**, in 2019 and 2020

INDUSTRIAL GROWTH RATE

Andhra Pradesh's industrial growth rate rose significantly to **12.8%** by 2021-22, a substantial increase from 3.2% in 2018-19, elevating the state's position from 22nd to **3rd in India's industrial rankings**



The Global Investment Summit has witnessed the highest-ever investments, totalling **13.5 lakh crore**. Additionally, this influx of investments is expected to result in the creation of **6 lakh jobs**

Since Jagan assumed office in 2019, **85000 jobs** have been created by setting up **127** large industries with an investment of **Rs. 67000 crore**

Since 2019, under Jagan's leadership, 16.5 lakh jobs have been generated by 2.5 lakh MSMEs, marking a 4X increase compared to the previous government

LAND OWNERSHIP RIGHTS



INTEREST FREE LOANS & CROP INSURANCE

Jagan's government provided **54 lakh** farmers with free crop insurance of **Rs. 7802 crore and 74 lakh farmers** with interest-free loans of **Rs. 1834 crore**, Additionally, crop loss during the kharif season is covered with an input subsidy that has so far been **Rs. 1965 crore**



Under Jagan's leadership, ownership rights have been granted to **20.27 lakh** farmer families for **35.18 lakh acres** of assigned lands







Andhra Pradesh saw negative growth of -6.5% in agriculture under Chandrababu but has improved under Jagan with a **growth rate of 8.2%**, jumping from 27th to **6th in national rankings**

The Jagan government paid Rs. 13,500 annually to farmers, exceeding their manifesto promise of **Rs. 12500**. Over **52 Iakh farmers** received **Rs. 31000 crore** investment aid. Andhra Pradesh is the only state that included tenant farmers in this scheme

Chandrababu's government neglected government schools, while under Nadu Nedu, Jagan's government is investing **16000 crore** in building infrastructure. It provides students with digital classrooms (IFP), tablets with Byju's content, Gorumudda, and Vidya Kanuka



Mothers with kids in grades 1-12th, with 75% attendance, get **Rs. 15000** deposited annually. **44 lakh mothers** have already benefited from this program and are sending their children to school





Since Jagan took office, Campus placements have increased significantly from just **37 thousand** in 2018-19 under the previous govt to **1.2 lakh students** placed in 2022-23

FEE REIMBURSEMENT



Chandrababu Govt left pending fee reimbursement arrears of **Rs. 1778 crore**. Jagan govt has cleared these dues and is implementing schemes totalling **Rs.15000 crore**, covering full fee reimbursement, education, accommodation, and foreign education



Under Jagan's leadership, Arogyasri services expanded to 3257 procedures, clearing the Rs. 686 crore dues from Chandrababu's tenure. Spending **Rs. 8800 crore**, providing **434** new 108 ambulances and making **936** new 104 ambulances available

AAROGYA AASARA

A scheme that provides post-operative assistance to economically disadvantaged and middle-class individuals has benefitted **15,64,997 people** with an allocated budget of **Rs. 971 crore**

MEDICAL INFRASTRUCTURE



At the expenditure of **Rs. 16000 crore**, Jagan government is building **17** new medical colleges, renovating **11** existing medical colleges and modernizing district & area hospitals, CHCs, PHCs, **10000** YSR clinics and **542** UHCs

FAMILY DOCTOR PROGRAMME



So far, **1.9 crore people** have received **12** medical services, **14** types of tests, and **105** types of medicines via PHCs and YSR Village Health Clinics

INVESTMENT FOR WELFARE



Through DBT - **Rs. 2.38 lakh crore**, and through non-DBT - **Rs. 1.67 lakh crore**, a total benefit of **Rs. 4.69 lakh crore** have been provided for welfare in the four years since Jagan assumed power

PENSIONS

Chandrababu's pension scheme provided just Rs. 1000 to 39 lakh beneficiaries, whereas Jagan's government has given **Rs. 2750 to 66 lakh beneficiaries**. The pensions has been increased to **Rs. 3000** from January 2023. Jagan is spending **4.5X** more than the average monthly expenditure of the previous Government



DOOR-TO-DOOR SERVICES



Under the previous government, Janmabhoomi Committees faced corruption and extortion charges. In Jagan's regime, **1.3 Iakh** village/ward secretariat employees and **2.65 Iakh** village/ward volunteers serve **1.6 crore** families directly at their homes, ensuring a corruption-free, service-oriented environment

WELFARE OF POOR AND WEAKER SECTIONS

During Chandrababu's five-year term, only Rs. 20000 crore were spent on welfare schemes for SC, ST, BC, and Minorities. Under Jagan's leadership, this expenditure increased by **10x to Rs. 2.5 lakh crore** in just four years

Are all government welfare schemes effectively reaching the doorsteps of every deserving individual through volunteers who serve in every 50 houses under the Village Secretariat system in our village, without the need to navigate government offices? This is a fundamental aspect of democratic governance!



#### A Crusade for the Poor

Jagan is pressing the button for a golden future for the people of the state. He aims to stand beside farmers and students, assist the weaker sections in achieving self-sufficiency by offering self-employment opportunities, and bring economic self-reliance to our elder sisters. Does this act demonstrate foresight or not?



#### No corruption.. Standard Qualification

Welfare schemes being provided to all eligible individuals solely based on merit, without regard to caste, religion, political affiliations, bribes, corruption, or referrals? What else constitutes the cornerstone of good governance?



#### English Medium studies for the Poor

In contrast to English medium education, which is only accessible to those attending private schools and the affluent, digital education is now

offered free of charge to underprivileged children enrolled in our government schools. BYJUS Tablets, interactive flat panels in classrooms, and adherence to international standards exemplify the visionary nature of this educational initiative.



#### Government Schools at par with Private Schools

The face of government schools has undergone a transformation, resembling that of private institutions. Each school now boasts attractive buildings, well-furnished classrooms, ceiling fans, ample lighting, clean drinking

water, and sanitary facilities. This environment has fostered a sense of enthusiasm among students as they eagerly attend school. Is this not a manifestation of a forward-thinking vision for investment in education?



#### Golden Chapter in Medical Sector

16000 crore invested in Nadu-Nedu, for the development of infrastructure at every level, alongside Aarogyasri, which offers free private medical care to the underprivileged. Village and urban clinics further extend medical care to the people. Has any previous ruler accomplished this without causing excessive burdens on the people?



#### 17 new Medical Colleges

There have been 11 government medical colleges in the state since Independence. However, within the last four years, the construction of 17 new medical colleges, at a cost of Rs. 8480 crore, has commenced. Admissions have already begun in five of these colleges this year, resulting in the addition of more than 2500 new MBBS seats. This is the embodiment of what 'vision' truly represents'!



#### **Family Doctor**

The underprivileged don't have to visit doctors; instead, doctors visit every village, offering free medicines. The government, under the Jagananna Aarogya Suraksha scheme, is actively guiding and supporting the people. Introducing a family doctor, traditionally accessible only to the affluent, to the villages is a testament to the benevolence of a compassionate leader.



#### Over 90 lakh Certificates issued

How else can you define good governance, when over 9 million certificates are delivered directly to people's homes, placing them in their hands, instead of requiring individuals to visit government offices for a variety of certificates such as income, caste, birth, and death certificates?
